
Latisha Benoit & Silviana



All nominations will be considered under the following criteria. The nominee:

- 3. must be a member of the NSEF and have, through their volunteer activities, made a special and significant contribution to equestrian sport.

The nominations should include a complete personal and equestrian résumé that lists the nominee's major accomplishments and contributions with corresponding dates.

THE NSEF SPONSOR OF THE YEAR AWARD

The NSEF Sponsor of the Year Award recognizes an outstanding company who has given generously to the sport of equestrian through monetary or product sponsorship. The company can sponsor local, regional or national events throughout the calendar year.

THE NSEF SERVICE AWARD

The NSEF Service Award recognizes an individual for a minimum of 10 years of service to the equestrian sport of NS. This individual gives tirelessly and has made a significant difference to the equestrian community.

All nominations will be considered under the following criteria. The nominee:

- 2. must be a member of the NSEF and have, through their volunteer activities, made a special and significant contribution to equestrian sport.

Equine Canada Bylaws to be Reconsidered

Members of Equine Canada (EC) from across Canada recently had an opportunity to vote on draft revisions to the national sports federation's Bylaws. Although a general meeting to accommodate in-person voting on the Bylaws during the Canadian Interprovincial Championships in Bromont, Quebec on September 22/12, saw the revisions accepted almost unanimously, an advanced on-line voting served to defeat the revisions.

"We have heard from many members from all parts of Canada," reports EC President Mike Gallagher, "that they were unaware we had embarked upon a revision to our Bylaws, as well as the rationale and realities driving the need for these revisions.

"Following the failure of the revisions to be adopted, the

Board has decided to undertake more fulsome stakeholder communications in order to better engage and educate members, in addition to removing any barriers to a successful relationship with our partners and members." The Board expects to begin this new process within the next few months- communication with members will include opportunities for information sessions during provincial and regional equestrian sport organization gatherings.

"HOW DO I BECOME A CERTIFIED COACH?" By: SHEILA CURRIE, NSEF PROVINCIAL COACH COORDINATOR

One of the most common questions I get asked regarding the NCCP coaching program is "how do I become certified?" The specifics of the steps depend on which discipline and certification context, but generally speaking, the steps are the same.

Step 1: Determine the context that is best based on your ability to coach or instruct specific athlete types.

As discussed in the spring 2012 edition of the NSEF's Hoofprints newsletter, there are no longer levels that you must work through in the coaching program. Instead, the new system trains and certifies coaches to teach specific riders with specific goals. You can also choose to be evaluated in more than one context.

Step 2: Find a mentor

Look for a **Current, NCCP Certified** Equestrian Instructor/Coach to work with and mentor under while you are preparing for your evaluation. Although there is no longer a mandatory mentoring component to the NCCP coach certification program, certified instructors/coaches are knowledgeable in the program and are a great asset to coach candidates. The specific mentor program will be developed with your mentor

and varies from coach to coach depending on experience level.

Step 3: Prerequisites

Once you determine the certification context in which you are going to be evaluated, complete the prerequisites for that context and submit them to NSEF (please indicate what discipline and context on the paperwork). Many of the pre-requisites are the same for all contexts.

Step 4: Training Opportunities (Recommended)

There are several excellent coach training opportunities available for coaches and coach candidates. Although currently not required, they are strongly recommended. Contact NSEF to be added to our coach candidate list so that we can send you clinic information directly. The next Competition Coach Workshop will be held in December (see page 7).

Evaluation







Definition:

A head-trauma-induced alteration in mental status that may or may not involve a loss of consciousness.

People who have lost consciousness have a concussion or worse! A person does not need to lose consciousness to have a concussion!

A concussion may be caused by a direct blow to the head, face, neck or anywhere else on the body that causes a severe and sudden movement to the head.

COMMON SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

Symptoms are often subtle

- headache
- pressure in head
- neck pain
- dizziness
- balance problems
- nausea and vomiting
- vision problems
- hearing problems/ringing
- "don't feel right"
- · feeling "dinged" or "dazed"
- confusion
- · feeling slowed down
- feeling like in "a fog"
- · drowsiness
- · fatigue or low energy
- · more emotional than usual
- · irritability
- · difficulty concentrating
- · difficulty remembering

PREVENTION - Reduce the risk of brain injury:

- Appropriate protective equipment should be worn properly and replaced when damaged. Approved helmets should be used in all activities with a risk of head trauma.
- Adhere to the rules of the sport or activity. Play fair and play smart!

CONCUSSION MANAGEMENT GUIDELINES

Returning to an activity while still symptomatic is very dangerous.

When in doubt, sit them out!

Anyone suspected of having a concussion must be removed from the current activity, game or practice and seek medical evaluation.

What can I expect?

Concussion typically results in a fast onset of short term difficulties that resolve over time. You will need to rest until your concussion symptoms are gone. This means resting your body and mind until you have no symptoms of headache, fatigue, etc. Then your DOCTOR will advise that you go through a gradual increase in exercise and activity (listed below) before returning to your normal physical and mental activities.

Step 0 Complete physical rest - no exercise or exertion. Limit mental activities i.e. reading, TV, computers, video games. If these mental activities make your symptoms worse, stop immediately. No alcohol or drugs until you are symptom free.

Proceed to the next step ONLY if symptom free. If symptoms occur, drop back to the step where you do not have symptoms, then try to progress again.

Allow AT LEAST 24 hours between steps.

- Step 1 Light exercise/work such as walking or stationary cycling, reading.
- Step 2 Sport/work specific activity such as skating for hockey, computer use for work.
- Step 3 Sport practice no contact/work for short intervals.
- Step 4 Sport practice with body contact/work once cleared to do so by a MEDICAL DOCTOR. The time required to progress will vary with the severity of the concussion.
- Step 5 Return to full activity sport/work/school.

SECOND IMPACT SYNDROME

Even a seemingly mild blow to the head when post-concussion symptoms are still present can lead to significant problems. It has also been shown that multiple concussions can lead to irreversible changes such as memory loss and concentration problems.

Signs to watch for:

Problems could arise over the first 24-48 hours.

You should not be left alone and must go to a hospital at once if you have:

- · a headache that gets worse
- drowsiness and can't be woken up
- · inability to recognize people or places
- repeated vomiting
- unusual behavior or confusion
- signs of being very irritable
- a seizure
- · weak or numb arms or legs
- · unsteadiness on your feet
- slurred speech


